

The Thirty-fhird Session of this University, being the Thirteenth under the amended charter, will commence in the Autumn of 1865.

By virtue of the Royal Charter granted in 1821 and amended in 1852, the Governors, Principal, and Fellows of McGill College, constitate the Corporation of the University, and under the statutes framed by the Board of Governors, with approval of the Visitor, have the power of granting degrees in all the Arts and Faculties, in McGill College and in Colleges affiliated thereto.

The Statutes and Regulations of the University have been framer on the most liberal principles, with the view of affording to all classes of persons therreatest possible facilities for the attainment of mental culture and professional training. In its religious character the University is Protestant, but not denominational; and, while all possible attention will be given to *tie character and conduct of students, no interference with their peculiar religious views will be sanctioned:

## I. MOGILL COLLEGE.

The Faculty of Abts.-The complete course of study in Arts extends over four Sessions, of eight months each; and includes Classics and Mathematics, with English Literature, Lo sic, Mental and Moral Science, Natural Science, and Modern Languages: all of which subjects are imperative in the three first years of the Course; but in the fourth year options are allowed in favour of the Honour Courses in Classics, Mathmatics, Mental and Moral Science, Natural Science, and English Literature. Certain exemptions are also allowed to professional students. There are also Special and Partial Courses, and facilities are afforded for the practice of Meterological observations, and for the study of Hebrew and Oriental Literature. The degrees given are B.A. and M.A.
Tie Faculty of Medione.-The complete course of study in Medecine extends over four Sessions, of six months each, and leads to the degrees of M. D., C. M.
Tee Faculty of Lati. -The complete course in Lat extends over three. Sessions, of six months each, and leads to the deares of B. C. I. and D. C. L.
