I had latterly felt disheartened in speaking to the young man and I went into the cottage almost reluctantly. He was glad to see me, and told me joyfully that at last he had been offered a good situation with a florist in the United States; he was to get a liberal salary and to have a comfortable home. I listened attentively to him, and then, as I wished him good bye, said to him, remember it is written in God's word: "Seek ye first the kingdom of God, and His righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you (Matt. vi. 33). He went to the States and after an interval he wrote to say that he had found his situation everything that he desired.
