

and 675 lbs. butter. Highland Ladoga-Mercos made 3.96 lbs. butter and 9.44 lbs. fat in 7 days. A week later she won the first prize in the maternal cow at the Guelph Winter Fair, giving the most milk scoring second last fair, 66 lbs. a day, or 4.56 per cent. This cow is owned by R.O.P., as a three-year-old, 12,644 lbs. milk, testing 3.61 per cent.

In the herd are two of her daughters, and a bull calf, also her half sister Highland Ladoga Colantha, a three-year-old giving 7 day record of 55.81 lbs. butter and 69.63 lbs. milk in 12 days. In 1915 she gave year as a three-year-old average test, 3.57 per cent, freshening a few weeks too late to enter in the 1915 contest. She was also a Junior four-year-old, made in 7 days 25.39 lbs. butter and 62.11 lbs. milk; R.O.P. in three years gave 11,700 lbs. milk in 30 months; average test 3.61 per cent. fat. Two of her half sisters, Princess Pauline De K and senior four-year-old, and Princess Pride De Kol, mature have made 33.9 lbs. butter and 52.9 lbs. milk, and 33.74 lbs. butter, 54.2 lbs. milk respectively.
