Mercantile Summary.

THE EXCISE duty on spirits manufactured from molasses, in bond, has been reduced from 65c. to 63c. per gallon.

THE FIRST tea-ship for Canada this year will be due about the Queen's Birthday. She sailed from China on Jan. 13th, and is consigned to a Montreal firm. The value of her cargo may be judged from the fact that the Canadian duty upon it is estimated at \$20,000.

A NEW semi-weekly line of freight steamers will ply this summer between Montreal, Glasgow and Liverpool, connecting with the Grand Trunk Railway. Mr. Allan has perfected the arrangements for these steamers, which, we understand. are to be a separate and additional line to the main " Allan Line."
