be our duty, on all occasions, to promote to the utmost of our power.

His Excellency was then pleased to give his Assent to the following Bill:

"An Act for applying certain Monies therein mentioned; for the service of the year of our Lord; one thousand eight hundred and two, and for appropriating such part of the supplies granted in this Session of General Assembly, as are not already appropriated by the Laws or Acts of the Province."

After which his Excellency was pleased to make the following Speech

Mr. President and Gentlemen of the Council, Mr. Speaker and Gentlemen of the Assembly,

THE public business being completed, it now only remains to consider your private convenience, which I always meet with great pleasure, and grant a recess, that your own affairs may not be incommoded by your longer absence from them.

I return you my due acknowledgments for the liberal Supplies provided for the support of His Majesty's Government, and the improvement of the Province, which shall be faithfully applied, to the utmost means that may be in my power.

And afterwards the President of His Majesty's Council, by his Excellency's Command, said,

Gentlemen.

IT is his Excellency's Will and Pleasure, that this General Assembly be prorogued to Thursday the Twenty-second day of July next, to be then here held, and this General Assembly; is accordingly prorogued to Thursday the Twenty-second day of July next.
