That the House go into a Committee of the whole House to take into confideration the Bill, entitled "An Act for ascertaining, laying out and fixing the Lines and Boundaries of three Counties, and of the different Townships into which this Island is divided, and for more readically adjusting all differences between Parties, when it appears that a set- tlement or improvements have been made by mistake on one Township for another, and also for raising by affessment a sufficient Fund, out of which to defray the expences of ascertaining, laying out, and fixing the said boundary Lines." J. F. Holland, Esq. in the Chair;

After some time spent therein the Speaker resumed the Chair and the Chairman reported progress and desired leave to sit again.
