BRITAIN IS ROUSED TO HER TASK; SIXTEEN MUNITION FACTORIES ESTABLISHED—PREMIER ASQUITH COUNSELS NATION

Will Double Shell Supply and Enable Army to Cleave a Way to Victory, Says Lloyd-George—Mr. Asquith Delivers Noteworthy Address.

London, July 29.—Sixteen national munitions factories have been established in England, and, after consultation with the French ministry, the British government has decided to set up an additional ten large establishments.

GERMAN ARMIES ARE BEING SLOWLY CAUGHT IN STRATEGIC SPIDER'S WEB

Marked Difference Noted in Fighting on Northern and Southern Fronts—Tropical Heat Makes Existence Burdensome.

London, July 29.—Telegraphing from Petrograd, the Morning Post's correspondent says: "There is a marked difference in the manner in which the Russians are dealing with the attacks on the northern and southern fronts. The latter is the scene of hard fighting, inch by inch, and the Germans have made no general progress here, but are making prolonged pauses over the greater proportion of their front in order to detach reinforcements for the purpose of bringing into line the backward sections."

BECKER'S BEARING EXTREMELY CALM AND RESIGNED

PAYMENT ASKED ON LEELANAW

Statement Being Drafted by U. S. for This Purpose.

Washington, July 29.—State department officials to-day were drafting a note to Germany asking payment for loss of the American steamer Leelanaw, torpedoed by a German submarine off the Orkney Islands last Sunday on the route of the violation of the Prussian-American treaty of 1828.

AMERICAN SAILORS GUARD CONSULATE

Washington, July 29.—The French consulate at Cape Haitien, Haiti, is menaced by revolutionists, and a guard from the United States auxiliary cruiser Eagle has landed to protect it.

SHIPMENTS HELD UP BY BLOKKADE

Goods Consigned to American Citizens Are Heaped Up in Rotterdam.

Washington, July 29.—Goods consigned to American citizens valued at \$150,000,000 are lying on the docks of Rotterdam, Holland, held up by the British order-in-council forbidding all commerce with Germany or Austria. Much of the merchandise is of German origin and cannot be moved pending the result of the British-American negotiations over the order-in-council.

AERIAL TRAGEDY BEFELL AVIATORS

London, July 29.—Except from Sckalm, Galicia, where the Russians claim by a counter offensive to have thrown back the Austro-Hungarians across the Tisza River, little definite news reached London this morning from the eastern battle front. To the east of the Narew River the extent of the German advance from Rozan is marked by the capture of the village of Goumarow, which lies only six miles from the river.
