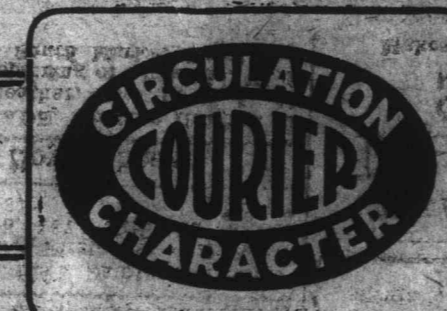

Chinese Minister Was Murdered

THE Government of the Chinese Republic has communicated with that of this Dominion requesting that every endeavor be made to secure information incidental to the assassination at Victoria, B.C., recently of the Hon. Tang Hua Lung, Minister of Education and former Minister of the Interior at Peking, an international political crime which it is suspected may have deep significances even beyond the domestic circle of what was until recently the world's most ancient monarchy, and is now its newest, republic and the first in the far east. Pending further developments the bodies of the unfortunate minister and of his assassin, Chung Wong (also known as Mah Chew) have been embalmed and in due course will be despatched to China. Chung Wong committed suicide immediately after the fulfillment of his mission.

The authorities at Victoria held the sensational incident of the murder in great formal terms and such as were self-apparent from the beginning—the Orientals watched proceedings with mask-like faces and still tongues—the jury promptly returned a verdict of murder against the dead man who had been seen to do the shooting—and the impelling motives in the tragedy remain to the white community as complete a mystery as before.

That the assassination was a purely political crime and quite in accord with Oriental methods was conclusively established from the outset. Indeed the ill-fated minister had been warned that an attempt on his life was contemplated and had altered his travel plans accordingly, for the avoidance of San Francisco, from which port he had originally intended to sail in returning to China, but where he had reason to suspect death lurked in wait for him. While a member of the Republican Cabinet, Hon. Tuan Hua Lung was credited with devotion to the individual cause of Tuan Chi Tai, who in turn was suspected by the southern or radical wing of Chinese republicanism as secretly favoring a restoration of the monarchy with himself on the throne, and to be not unkindly to suggestions of Teutonic assistance.

The murderer himself in a letter left for his business partner, Ngong Long Sab, declares: "I cannot bear to sit here and watch my country perish. I have determined to set with blood and iron doctrine. When you see this do not worry on my account. What I shall do you will see."

This cryptic letter was dated "the seventh year of the Chinese Republic, September the 1st."

Suggesting that the deed of blood might have been inspired thereby, the crown authorities at Victoria produced at the inquest held on the dead statesman's body an article that had been published in "The New Republic," British Columbia's morning Chinese newspaper, the day that the deed was done, a translation of which article in part reads:

"It is said that the coming of Tan Hua Lung to America this time is for the purpose of attempting to borrow foreign loans privately for Tuan Chi Tai. Although I cannot say for sure whether this is or not, judging from Mr. Wang's movements during the recent years I cannot help being suspicious. In my opinion, you really for the purpose of borrowing loans for Tuan Chi Tai. If so, what are the ways of the expenditure? Against Germany? It is simply to be used for doing harm to our dear old country. Even those citizens who do not think of punishing him, regard as guilty the one who attempts to make loans privately for him and who is certainly more so. If the object of Tang Hua Lung's coming to America is not for the borrowing of foreign loans we leave it alone. If so Tang's guilt is ten or a hundred times more than that of the
