Well this is Thursday and haven't been sick yet, we are having a good time on the boat we will get in England about Saturday, then I will mall you this lefter, we have had a dandy trip so far not a bit rough; but it has been awful foggy most of the time.

The cake you sent was awful good, have got some of it yet, I put half of it in my mess tin.

We had plenty of good food on the boat, had, had oranges and apples twice they were quite a treat. I think I will close for tonight as we have to go to bed at nine o'clock, then the lights are turned out.

Here it is Friday night, five whole days on the watch and haven't seen a single girl, nothing but water and one small tug. I see Eddy Hennigar every day he is orderly for Colonel Tremain he has a good job; but does not know how long it will last. There is a heavy sea today but the ship does not mind it, is so large, we are in dangerous waters now but we will get there safe.

There is six or seven Battalions on the ship. Well I think that is all. Will write when I get to headquarters so will say good by.
