Our University.

Spring is the season for improvements. New plans are made; larger undertakings are arranged for. The farmer plans for enlarging his fields, increasing their productivity and thus enhancing the value of his farm.

With this tendency in mind our thoughts have turned to the conditions at our university. Friends of Acadia must be encouraged by the advance that has been made during recent years.

There is no reason to fear, however, that the friends of the college will be satisfied with the progress attained or the victories achieved.

To-day the progressive college is adapting itself to modern life and is offering an almost bewildering variety of courses to its students.

In view of the present day demands for scientific and technical education we believe that the claims of ninety five per cent. of the living population should override the claims of tradition.

Biological is another demand in educational circles, and we are hoping to see a chair at Acadia devoted to this important subject.

One of the ambitions of the friends of the college has ever been to be able to provide an efficient and strong theological department. This department, while at present doing excellent work, requires additional facilities.

Then, having in mind the proper, safe and scientific culture of the physical side of life, it would apparently be a good and popular innovation at Acadia to have an expert athletic instructor to have charge of gymnastics both on the campus and in the gymnasium.

These additions, with the absolutely necessary strengthening of some other departments, appear to us the most pressing need of Acadia. If we are correct all that is needed is the proper and plain explanation to the 'institutions' constituency, and the necessary funds will be forthcoming.

A notice from the Montreal Liquidation Co., asking to be assessed, was read and referred to the assessors. A communication from the W. C. T. U. of the town, asking the Council to use their best endeavors to secure toilet accommodations at the railway station, was discussed, and the clerk was instructed to reply that under existing conditions there was no immediate prospect of securing such accommodations.
