STRAWBERRY FESTIVAL TO-NIGHT.—In St. George's Hall to-night the congregation of the Primitive Methodist church (Rev. Mr. Harris) will hold their annual strawberry festival. The Band of the Battery is expected to be present, and an enjoyable time can be spent listening to excellent music, and partaking of strawberries and cream and other delicacies. The ladies of the church have got up the Festival this year for a worthy object.

A WARNING concerning the toy balloons, which are peddled on the streets, is this given by medical authority:—Many of the most virulent diseases of the blood have lately been found to be communicated by these means, as each of these toys must pass through the mouths of three or four workmen before it is finished, and each is usually tried by the vendor while he is making the sale. Skin diseases, which have lately spread among the children in Paris and London, were propagated by these toys. Mothers should be on their guard to see that they are thoroughly cleaned before use.

SALT FORN.—Salt was struck on Wednesday at a depth of 125 feet in the test well which is being sunk at Blyth. The drill has penetrated the solid salt rock seven feet, and there is every indication of a good supply of salt rock.

HANNAH'S DEPARTURE.—A special cable despatch to the Globe says:—Ex-Governor Packard, Consul-General of the United States in Britain, entertained Hannan and his party at a splendid lunch at the Grand Hotel, Liverpool, previous to the champion's embarkation. Many leading citizens were present, and a most generous reception was given to the guest. Governor Packard congratulated Hannan most heartily, and wished him God-speed and a safe passage home. Hannan responded feelingly, after which Col. Shaw thanked the Consul-General for the great kindness, and the proceedings were brought to a close.
