SERBS NOT ALARMED OVER THE REPORTS

Official Jugo-Slavian quarters here are not alarmed over reports of revolutionary troubles in that country and declare diplomatic despatches from Belgrade yosterday indicated nothing amiss.

The Triest report of an uprising is attributed to "a faction of trouble making italians, who are seeking to embarrass the impending Italo-Serbian negotiations."
