## Kirwan's Letters from Europe.

NORTH WALES, July, 1860.

We left Caernarvon in the early morning; and by Bangor, and over the Tuber Bridge which spans the Menai Straits, and across the island of Anglesey, we sped our rapid course to Holyhead, to meet an engagement for the evening. Going to the Calvinistic chapel at the time appointed, we found a large congregation in waiting for us. We pursued the same order of service as in other places. Mr. Phillips concluded the services in Welsh, whilst we made addresses in English. The enthusiasm excited us to most marked, and the attention of the people, great. As it was the last day it was the most interesting, service we attended in Wales. The singing was such as had never been heard; it was singing with heart and soul, and making melody unto the Lord. The tunes, the language, did not suggest; but we were more moved by the earnest devotion of the people as all the organs, and Handel and Haydn Societies in the world could not move us! And when the services were ended by the singing of the Doxology, first in Welsh, and then, as if for our benefit, in English, the feelings of the people seemed wrought to the highest pitch. We felt somewhat as did Peter, on the Mount of Transfiguration, when he said, "let us make three tabernacles." The elders and chief men of the congregation, and several ministers of the town, collected around the pulpit; we were introduced to them all, and received from them all the warmest expressions of christian affection. They seemed aglow with the spirit of revival. That meeting around the pulpit we can never forget.

As we were taking our seats, at the depot, for Liverpool, in the early morning, we were recognized by some of the men in attendance there who were at the service of the previous evening. They came forward with their warm expressions of christian regards; and told us that of the fourteen hands employed at that station twelve had recently been converted. And, taking Mr. Stuart into a small room, they said to him, "In this room we need for prayer every day for the conversion of those two, and we will not let God go until he grants our request." Their earnestness was that of souls alive unto God.

We are less acquainted with the Welsh in the United States than we are with the English, the Irish, or the Scotch. They are a less migratory people. And when they do emigrate, by reason of their language, they are more continental than others from Britain. But they are a highly educated people loving the Bible, the Word, and the minister. They are a blessing to this land, and must be to all who come within the tide of emigration. We have seen, heard, and learned much of the work of grace in America, and in England, and in Scotland, and in Ireland; but we doubt whether the greatest work of revival in Wales has been exceeded in depth and power by any similar work in ancient or modern times.
