Latest War News.

New York, June 16.—A despatch to the Herald from Cadiz via Gibraltar says: There is great excitement here owing to fears of the American fleet coming to Spain. It has decided to send further reinforcements to the Balearic Islands, the Canaries and Ceuta.

The auxiliary cruiser Ciudad de Cadiz has left here under sealed orders. From hints gathered in official circles it is believed the squadron will sail singly or in pairs under sealed orders to meet at a given point, probably on the high seas, some rendezvous in the Sargasso sea, off the Azores, where the vessels will be outside the usual track of shipping and able to wait quietly for their consorts in order to sail together.

A consultation has been held between Marquis Camillas, the president of the Trans-Atlantic company, and Captain Annon respecting the retention of the British engineer of the auxiliary cruisers. Bissett, an engineer on the Leon XIII, has signed for one.

General Valdez has arrived with more ammunition. A report has reached Cadiz that Rear Admiral Dewey is short of ammunition.

San Francisco, June 15.—The transports Zalandia, China, Colon and Sar sailed for Manila with the second Philippine expedition at 1.45 p. m. to-day under command of General F. V. Greene.

The Spanish reserve squadron, under the command of Admiral Canaris, has not sailed from Cadiz yet. All the vessels belonging to the squadron were anchored there to-day.

Several attempts to find landing places for the United States troops, within a distance of two miles west of Santiago, have demonstrated, along with previous enquiries, that the shore for fifteen miles is lined with Spaniards.

When Rear Admiral Sampson yesterday received advice that upwards of thirty transports would be here to-day (Saturday) he sent word that they should stand to the south ten miles and lie there until a landing place had been secured.

Madrid, June 19, 7 p. m.—A private despatch received here from New York says General Shafter's expedition has landed near Santiago De Cuba and will attack the town immediately.

Kinston, N. C., June 18.—A hot brush between some Spanish troops and a reconnoitering party in cutters occurred at daylight Friday morning in a small cove west of Morro Castle, Santiago.

The Yankee arrived here Thursday and Captain Brown reported that on Monday last while the Chesapeake and Spanish gunboat came out to meet the Yankee, evidently mistaking her for a merchant vessel.

HALIFAX, N. S., June 11.—The unusual occurrence of two fatal accidents on the I. C. R. R. was made known to-day, when two trains arrived at Truro, each having the body of a man killed on the rails.
