**Siki And Beckett**  
On December 7

The fight between Battling Siki, the Senegalese conqueror or Georges Carpenter, and Joe Beckett, the English heavyweight, will take place in London on December 7 has been officially announced by the international boxing union, under whose auspices the bout was at first announced to take place on November 23.

The articles, which have been ratified by the international union call for a 26 round encounter and will be for the official heavyweight title of Europe, as neither Beckett nor Siki are able to make the light-heavyweight limit. The Senegalese will fight around 185 pounds, which is ten pounds heavier than the weight he fought at in the Carpenter struggle. The fight will be staged at the Olympia.

The original agreement, which was made last Sunday, called for the fight to take place November 23, but Major Arnold J. Wilson, Beckett's manager asked that it be postponed to a later date. Both fighters have made the deposits required by the rules of the International Boxing Union. The amount guaranteed to the fighters were not made public, but the Associated Press understands from a most reliable authority that Siki will receive £7,000 win, lose or draw.

**BATHURST CO. SELLS BONDS IN MONTREAL**

\$,500,000 Bought By Royal Securities

To finance construction of a newsprint mill of fifteen thousand tons annual capacity to be completed by May of next year, and to increase productive capacity of sulphate pulp to 19,500 tons, the Bathurst Company of Bathurst, N. B., has sold to Royal Securities Corporation \$1,500,000 of 6 1/2 p. c. first mortgage convertible sinking fund-gold bonds, series "B", due June 1st, 1941.

The Bathurst Company in 1921 took over the Bathurst Lumber Company, which had been in successful operation for fourteen years. The Company manufactures some 30,000 tons of sulphate and sulphite pulp and approximately 30,000,000 feet of spruce lumber per annum. Its leasehold New Brunswick and Quebec timber limits total 2,563 square miles, which are estimated to contain 2,000,000,000 cords of spruce sawlogs and 10,000,000 cords of pulpwood. Timber areas are situated on rivers tributary to Bathurst Harbour, N. B. and the Baie des Chaleurs, Que. The Company is one of the largest manufacturing enterprises in Canada. Its plants and hydro-electric development of 9,000 h. p. are of recent construction. At Bathurst the Company has its own deepwater docks, from which shipments are made direct to the United States, South America, British West Indies, England and Europe.

Average sales for the last four years totalled over \$2,900,000 per annum. Net earnings 1917 to 1920 inclusive averaged \$577,778. Last year in common with other pulp and lumber manufacturers, the Company showed a loss after all charges of about \$300,000, due to exceptionally adverse market conditions. The Company's plants are now running full and its current operations are showing a substantial profit.

The new issue of \$1,500,000 of Bonds is the balance of a closed first mortgage of \$3,000,000, the first \$1,500,000 of which having been distributed a year ago in the United States market by Callaway, Fish & Company, of New York.

Properties securing the Bonds have an appraised value of \$9,250,000, plus over \$1,000,000 to be spent on the new newsprint mill, making property values in excess of 10,000,000, against \$3,000,000 of Bonds outstanding.

Junior to the Bonds are \$9,774,200 of Common Shares, which shares are closely held mostly by Directors of the Company and wealthy banking and manufacturing interests in Montreal and Ottawa, Buffalo and the Lehigh Valley in Pennsylvania. Common dividends of 6 p. c. were paid in 1917, 1918, 1919, and 1920, with a 3 p. c. dividend in 1921.

The Bonds are convertible into an equal amount of Common Shares at any time, at the option of the holder which is an unusually attractive feature of the issue.

It is expected that Royal Securities will make public issue of the Bonds at an early date, both in Canada and the United States.
