OTTAWA, Nov. 17, 1906. Each Province concerned was represented by its Premier and Attorney General. They were met at Ottawa by the Premier of Canada with the Minister of Justice and the Minister of the Interior. The representatives of the Provinces came prepared to discuss the whole question and to reach a con-clusion if possible. No opportunity was allowed them. Sir Wilfrid reosived their written statements, remarked that he and his two colleagues were a committee of the Dominion Cabinet appointed to meet the Provincial delegates, and promised that their memorials would receive consideration. He then bade them good-bye and disappeared with his two colleagues. The Provincial Ministers began to wonder why they were asked to come. The statements they handed in might have been sent by mail with a great deal less trouble. Nor was it very clear why a committee of the Dominion Government was necessary to receive these three papers.. It may be presumed that when Sir Wilfrid asked the Provincial Ministers to come to Ottawa for the conference he expected to hold a discussion and make some attempt to reach a settlement. But the Cabinet seems to have reached a condition when it is incapable of settling anything except matters of patronage. The officer who succeeds Mr. Preston, of "hug-the machine" notoriety, in the Immigration Department at London, has restored Mr. C. F. Just to his position in the offices at Charing Cross. Mr. Preston dismissed Mr. Just last year alleging that there were irregularities in his accounts. It was not clearly explained what these faults were, but light was thrown on the dismissal by the Parliamentary Committees of last session. They discovered that early in 1905 Mr. Just, who was then in charge of the office in London in Mr. Preston's absence, cabled to the Deputy Minister the announcement that the Department had paid £2,900 to the Arundel Printing Company of London, for £900 worth of printing. It did not take Mr. Preston long to get rid of Mr. Just, after he began to make disclosures like these. The Chief Commissioner had apparently adopted the motto of the Biglow Papers: "And withered be the nose that

pokes Inter the Gov'ment Printin'."

DIVISION OF THE RAKE OFF. The Arundel Company, as the Public Accounts Committe discovered, was simply Mr. Roy Somerville, son of a former Liberal Member of Parliament, whom Mr. Preston found in London and made a Government contractor for printing, though he had no printing office and the work had previously been done by one of the largest establishments in England. Some \$60,000 was paid to this favorite for immigration printing. 


