Ottawa Weekly Letter. CONFERENCE DID NOT CONFERR. Provincial Ministers brought to Ottawa to Discuss the Boundary Question and Sent Home Without Discussion.

ARUNDEL CONTRACT RECALLED. C. F. Just Discovered a Scandal—Finding Triple Prices Paid for Government Printing—He was Dismissed by Preston—How Profits were Divided—Preston Was Promoted and Just Was Restored.

FALSE PRETENCES TO IMMIGRANTS. Will Be Severely Punished in England—The Crime Has Had Canadian Official Encouragement.

GOVERNMENT HAND-CAPPED. By Mr. Hyman's Equivocal Position—Further Discoveries in Ballot Conspiracies.

MR. BRODEUR IN TROUBLE. Once Rebuked in Montreal—Now Hesitating and Uncertain.

OTTAWA, NOV. 17, 1906. The conference called here at the beginning of this week by Sir Wilfrid Laurier to re-adjust the boundaries of Ontario, Manitoba and Saskatchewan by assigning to one, two or all of them the present District of Keowatin, was a brief affair.

Each Province concerned was represented by its Premier and Attorney-General. They were met at Ottawa by the Premier of Canada with the Minister of Justice and the Minister of the Interior. Ontario presented a memorial asking for a large part of
