The Northwest Miller (Minneapolis) says:

The flour output last week was 121,170 barrels,

against 114,100 barrels the week before and

100,000 barrels for the corresponding time in

1908. The flour market is strong, but sales are

restricted to comparatively small limits, and do

not equal the manufacture. The export

shipments for last week were 35,270 barrels

against 27,850 barrels the preceding week. The

spring wheat crop has gone into the ground

under the most promising conditions. It is

late, but otherwise there is now no justifiable

complaint from any large section of an un-

favorable situation. There appears to be no

place now suffering for rain.
