Imported Canadian Plumbers Arrested

in Buffalo-Michigan Miners Idle. Buffalo, N. Y., July 16.—Inspector DeBarry has apprehended half a dozen more Canadian plumbers who came here in response to advertisements or solicitations to fill the places made vacant by the strikers. He says their port of entry seems to be Wilson, N. Y., and he has ordered strict surveil-

lance of that port. Ishpeming, Mich., July 16.—Every iron ore mine in Ishpeming and Negaunee is idle, about 3,000 men being out. A mass meeting of Negaunee and Ishpeming miners was held today, and by vote it was decided to remain out until the mining companies advanced the pay of the miners to \$2 per day and the laborers to \$1 75.

Detroit, July 16.-The question of enjoining the International Cigarmakers' Union from boycotting L. Kuttnauer & Co. was taken up by Judge Swan yesterday afternoon, the judge deciding in favor of the cigarmakers.

DRIVING BACK THE OCEAN.

The Gigantic Work of Reclaiming Land

in Holland. The people of Holland have under taken a gigantic work, by means of which they expect to recover the larger portion of the territory now covered by the Zuyder Zee, the inland sea of the country, and twn it again into a fertile farming region. It is now just five centuries since the inundation of that part of the Netherlands now covered by the Zuyder Zee was completed, the encroachments of the sea having been going on for 225 years, previous to which time the territory was cover-

ed with forests.

By the most stupendous exertions about 350 square miles of conutry has already been recovered by an elaborate dyke system, which has gradually reclaimed section after section that was lost, but the new scheme transcends the previous work in extent and importance. The towns of the region which had become of considerable importance as seaports through the bringing of the waters of the ocean to their doors have lost considerable of that importance through the difficulties of navigation and the transfer of the trade to the North Holland canal and the Y ship canal, which connects the metropolis with the ocean. On this account the remnants of com-merce are not worth as much to the towns as the country would be after it is reclaimed, and therefore there is general acquiesence in the plan to drive the ocean out.

On account of the great cost it will be distributed over a period of 33 years, so as to make it less oppressive and to make the benefits gradually bear their share of the expense. A colossal sea wall is first to be built from North Holland to Friesland, shutting out the tides of the ocean. This wall will be 216 feet wide at the base and the top will be 17 feet above the sea level, while along the inner side and at some distance below the top will be a track wide enough for a top will be a track wide enough for a

wagon road and a railway.

After the sea is barred out the inclosed space to be reclaimed will inclose within separate embankments foru areas containing in the aggregate 750 square miles. One of these areas will be first drained by pumping the water over the embankment, the water finding its way to the sea through the main channel, and as the shallow portions become exposed they will be successively brought under cultivation. It is calculated that within ten years 25,-000 acres can be made annualy available, and in the end the inland sea will be reduced to a channel about fifteen miles wide called the Ysselmeer, communicating with the sea by locks at Wieringer, with Amsterdam by a branch three miles wide, and by an other with the mouth of the Yssel. The plan has received the sanction of the Government, and the engineers pronounce it feasible.—Milwaukee Jour-

WAS WITH THE ANGELS.

A Girl Lays in a Trance Three Months and Was in Heaven!

Motionless and speechless, little Etta Moody lay from April 20 until early yesterday morning. At that hour she moved slightly and began to talk. Thirty minutes later the doctors said she was dead. and full of life. About the first of the year the child seemed to be literally overflowing with animal spirits. She said it hurt her to keep still. The mother watched the child closely for two weeks, and not once did she see the child at rest. Etta began to grow thin from the constant motion, and a physician was called. He said the child was suffering from a disease of the nerves, but that she would outgrow it. On April 20, however, the disease assumed a violent form. For several hours on that day the child was in convulsions and screamed in agony. After a time the convulsions ceased and she became spechleess and motionless. Since April 20 she lay on her bed utterly oblivious to those about Her eyes were closed and her breathing regular, but otherwise she was as the dead. The child continued

in this condition until 2 o'clock yesterday morning, when the watchers saw her shudder. She sighed, opened her eyes, and said naturally to her mother:
"They are coming for me, mamma."
"Who?" asked the mother.
"The angels," said the child.
She began to talk of where she had been and what she had seen during her long trance. She talked as one who had returned from a long journey. At 3:30 o'clock, while in the mid-

dle of an animated description, the child cried in ecstasy; "I am going back; kiss me, mamma." Then she fell back, her breathing ceased, and fifteen minutes later the physicians pronounced her dead.

The child was buried yesterday afternoon, although many believe that she had fallen into another trance. The physicians, however, applied tests and are certain that life had fled.—Hallister (Fla.) dispatch to the New York Morn-
