Now let me put the record of Mr. Borden before you. He has only been

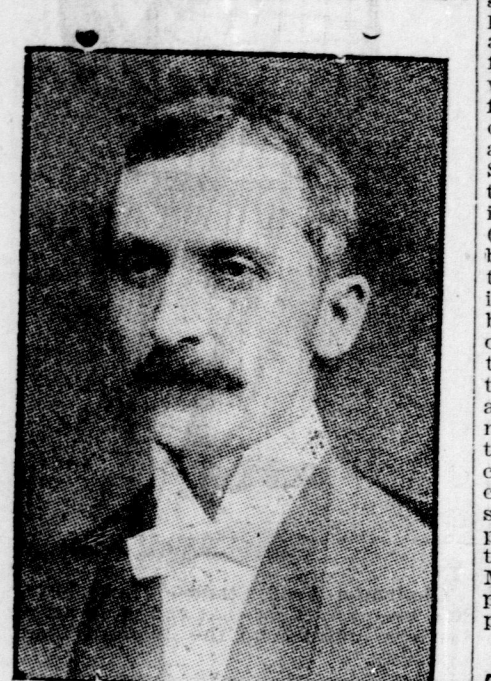

R. F. Sutherland, of Windsor, THE LIBERAL CANDIDATE.

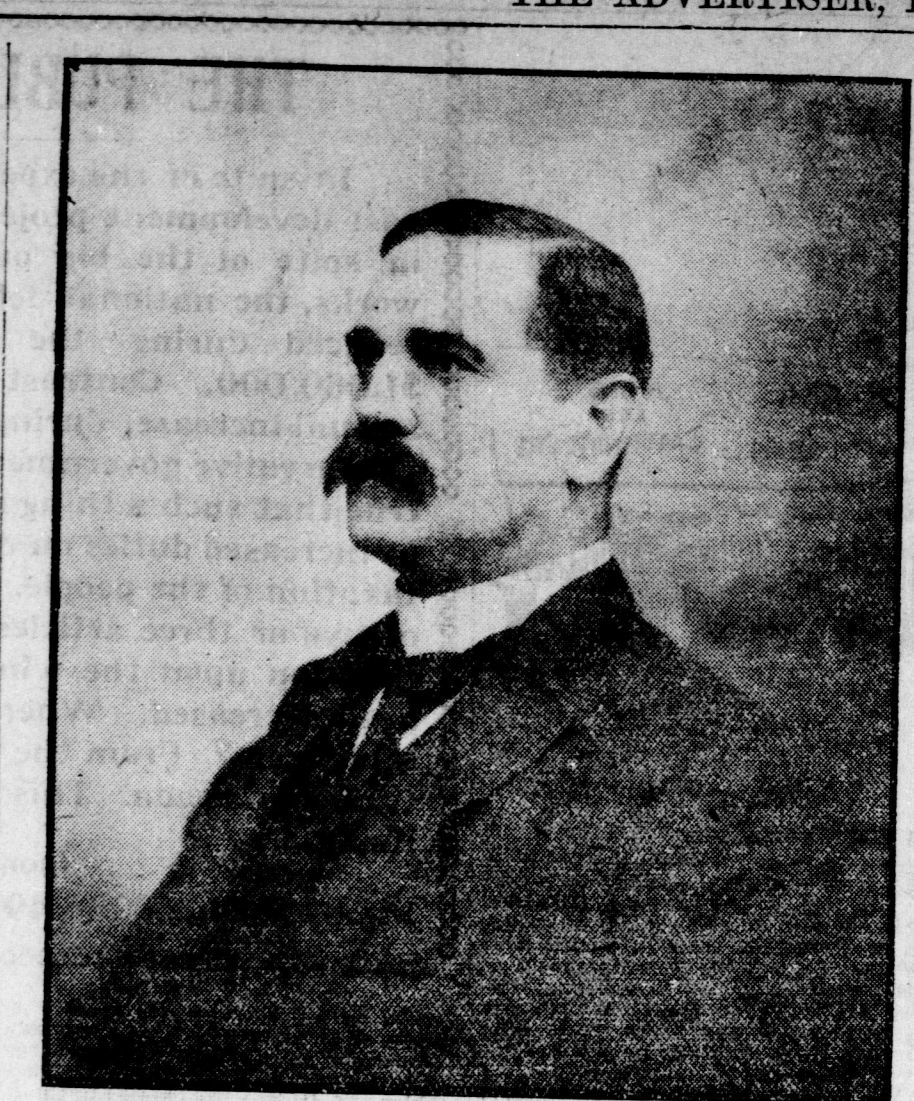

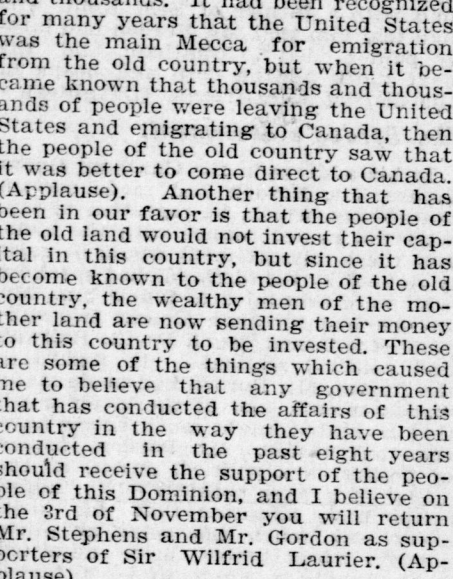
A. H. Clarke, K.C., of Windsor, THE LIBERAL CANDIDATE.

HON. CHARLES S. HYMAN, Member of the Dominion Cabinet Without Portfolio, Acting Minister of Public Works.

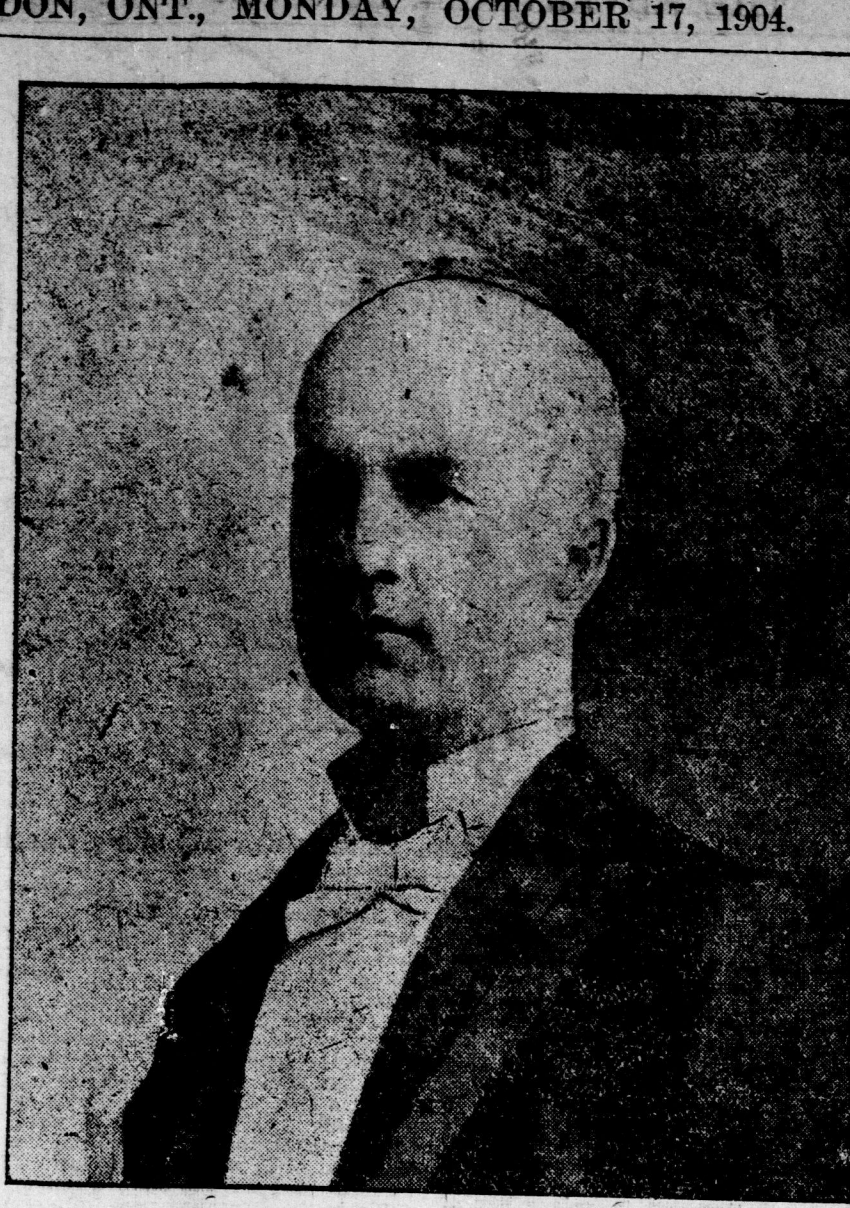
are Sir Charles Hibbert Tupper and Sir Charles Hibbert Tupper is not going to remain in Parliament. Look at the men whom Sir Wilfrid Laurier had behind him—Sir William Mulock, the man who has given the best administration, the best postoffice department, that this country has ever seen. Take the young man from the West, the Hon. Mr. Sifton—you know the record of emigration to this country prior to his taking office. What is the record since he occupied the department? He has administered his department with unqualified success, and the result is that Canada is commencing to get her share of emigration. They are pouring in from all parts of the country by the thousands and thousands. It had been recognized for many years that the United States was the main Mecca for emigration from the old country, but when it became known that thousands and thousands of people were leaving the United States and emigrating to Canada, then the people of the old country saw that it was better to come direct to Canada. (Applause.) Another thing that has been in our favor is that the people of the old land do not invest their capital in this country, but since it has been known to the people of the old country, the wealthy men of the mother land are now sending their money to this country to be invested. These are some of the things which caused me to believe that any government that has conducted the affairs of this country in the way they have been conducted in the past eight years should receive the support of the people of this Dominion, and I believe on the 3rd of November you will return Mr. Stephens and Mr. Gordon as supporters of Sir Wilfrid Laurier. (Applause.)



THE CHAIRMAN'S OPENING Demonstration the Most Enthusiastic Ever Seen in Kent.

Mr. Fred Stone, of the firm of Houson & Stone, barristers, of Chatham, was the chairman of the immense gathering. Mr. Stone is the president of the Kent Liberal Association, and in opening the meeting he made a few appropriate remarks. "I hardly know how to express myself today," he said. "We have had political demonstrations in the past—both Liberal and Conservative—but I am free to say that as long as I have been connected with politics in this country there never has been anything that equals in spontane-ous enthusiasm the demonstration of today. You know that in the past, leaders of a party which I need not name have come to Chatham time and again, and the result was that the very elements wept from pity. Today, the clouds have disappeared, the sun is smiling—earth and air and sky, all the elements, unite to welcome the Premier of Canada to our midst. (Applause.) The Conservatives may say that these are conditions over which we exercise no control. We have our own opinion about that, and we are free to say that the Conservatives may retain their opinion. However, the fact is that Sir Wilfrid is today met by a tribute of devotion and loyalty in the shape of this gathering, which I hope

he will take as an assured representation of the devotion and loyalty of these two ridings to him, and to the principles he has so ably upheld in the past." (Cheers.) Mr. Stone then introduced to the audience Mr. George Stephens, the member for West Kent in the last Parliament, who he said in two or three weeks more would again be the member.

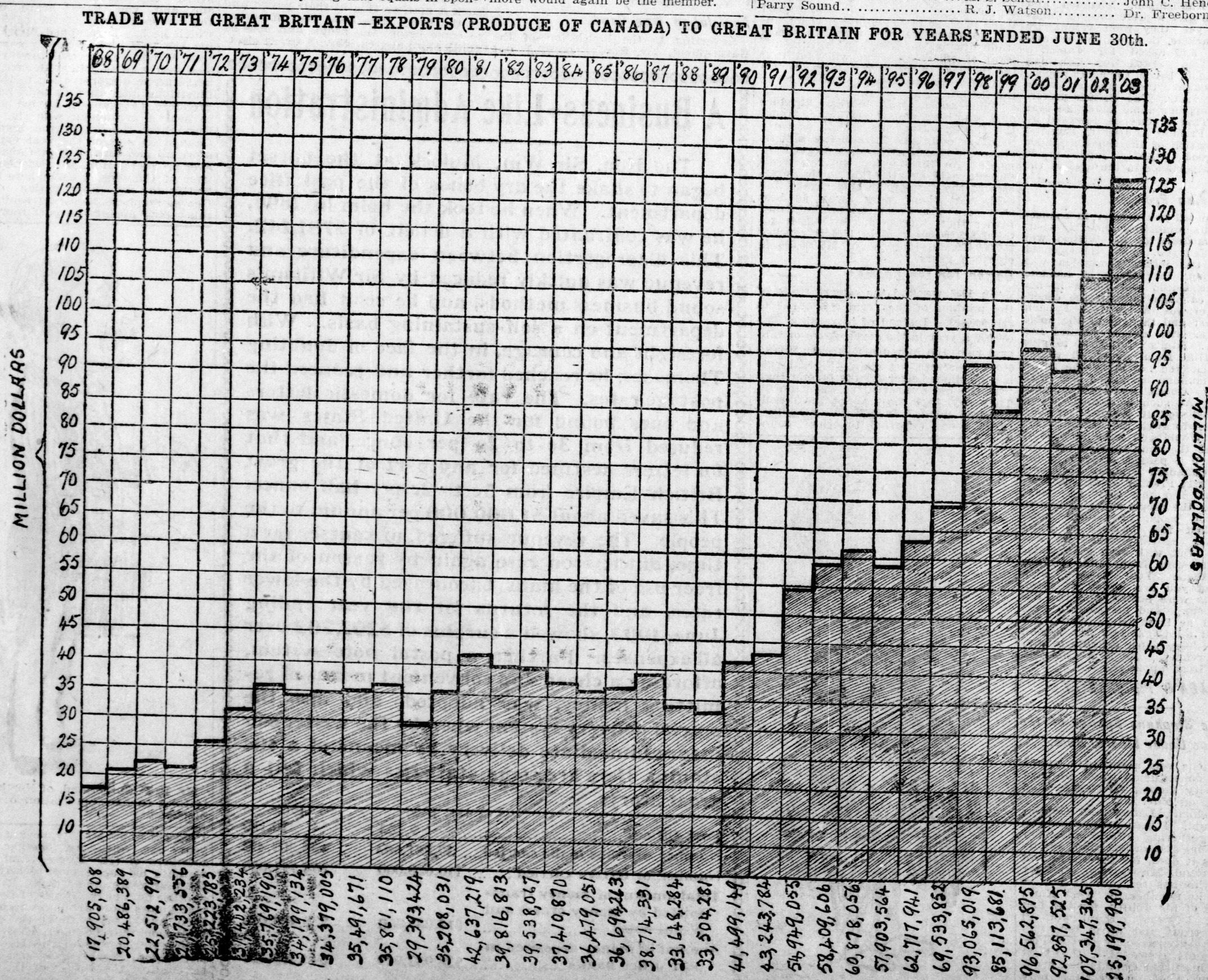


A. B. Aylesworth, K.C., New Member of the Dominion Cabinet, Who is Contesting Durham in the Liberal Interest.
