Reformer Mary Livermore Passes to Her Reward.

A GREAT WOMAN GONE

Melrose, Mass., May 23.—Mrs. Mary Livermore, the writer, died here today, Mrs. Mary Ashton Livermore was born in Boston on Dec. 19, 1820, and vas the daughter of Timothy Rice. After being educated in the Boston public chools and the Charleston Female Seminary, she was a teacher for a number of years. In 1845 she was married to Rev. D. P. Livermore, a Universilist dergyman, who died in 1899. Mrs. Livermore was the first president of the Illinois Women's Suffrage Association, and at the time of her leath she was president of the Massachusetts Women's Suffrage Associa-

Mrs. Livermore was active in the anti-slavery agitation and Washington temperance movement. During the civil war she took a leading part in the work of the United States sanitary commission. After her return to this state she was for ten years president of the Massachusetts Women's Christion Temperance Union. In the course of her work on the platform she de livered lectures all over this country and in England and Scotland. She also was the author of many books.

THE BOXER INDEMNITY

Russia Wants Hers in Silver and Payments Will Be Delayed.

Tien Tsin, May 23. - The settlement of the Boxer indemnity question has been delayed by the action of the Russo-Chinese Bank. Russia chosen to receive her portion of the indemnity in silver, and the Russo-Chinese Bank is endeavoring to obtain payment in Shanghai at the London price of silver instead of the price at Shanghai, thus avoiding extra charges, If China consents the bank will secure an advantage amounting to one pe centum. The powers have lodged protest against the proposition, and i considered probable that the Russo-Chinese Bank will not be successful in its negotiations. Na Tung, the Governor of Pekin, representing the board of revenue, did in fact consent, but his consent was not ratified. If China assents, the settlement of the indemnity question will be prolonged indefinitely, owing to the fact that similar advantages will be demanded in other quar


