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THE BIBLE AND THE SCHOOL

Toronto Presbyterian Synod Wants It
on the Curriculum.

Toronto, May 13.—The Presbyterian synod of Toronto and Kingston at their final session today declared in favor of having the English Bible taught in the schools.

A communication was read from the synod of Hamilton and London stating that a resolution had been passed by that body asking the other synods to join in a petition to the Legislature to enact laws placing the English Bible on the curriculum of the public schools. A motion was accordingly passed that the synod be prepared to take their part in the carrying out of the proposal mentioned.

The synod decided on still more ag-gressive educational work among the French in Quebec and Northern Ontario.

Another resolution was passed, re-ceiving the report of the aged and in-firm ministers' fund, and urging that the fund should receive more fully the sympathy and support of the Presby-terian ministry and congregations.

The synod took action at the re-quest of Rev. F. E. Pitts, of New Liskeard, dividing the division of the North Bay presbytery into two. The two divisions in the northern bound-ary of the forest reserve.

Dr. Gaudier made a stirring appeal for assistance for Knox College. He stated that of the \$200,000 for which they would appeal to the people, \$150,000 would be asked from the people of Toronto; \$75,000 has already been received. The closing of the synod will be held on the second Tues-day in May, 1910, in St. James' Square Church.
