On Fellow-Conspirators in Portugal's Royal Family.

[Associated Press Cable.] Lisbon, May 25. — The Government is awaiting the completion of the investigation of the statements made by an anarchist named Ramires, before taking action against those named as the conspirators in the assassiation of King Carlos and Crown Prince Luis in 1908. Ramires escaped to Brazil following the assassinations, but was recently arrested and brought back here. Subsequently he made a confession and gave to the police the names of 1,148 persons, including several prominent in politics, who, he

said, shared in the conspiracy. According to Ramires those selected for the killing were divided into four groups, and placed at as many points along the route of the royal carriages in order that if any one group failed the others would be prepared to execute the death designs.

MANY NEW COURTS **OPENED LAST YEAR**

President of Sugar Trust Sub- Anarchist Ramires "Squeals" Report of Inspector Show Division Courts Very Busy.

> Toronto, May 25.—During last year eight new courts were opened in On-tario, according to the annual report of Mr. J. B. Macdonald, inspector division courts for the province, which was issued yesterday. Of these three were in the district of Nipissing, at Elk Lake, Englehart and Cochrane; one in the district of Haliburton, at Dorset; one in the county of Lincoln, at Grimsby; one in the county of Oxford, at Tavistock; two in the county of Peterboro, at Havelock and Keene; and one court, in the county of Renfrew, at Calabogie, was abolished. The new district of Kenora, embracing part of the territory formerly included in the Rainy River District, was also created, and division courts continued at Kenora and Wabigoon. The district of Rainy River, being thus changed, has now three courts only.






