CARDINAL TASCHEREAU'S Mandment Against the Knights of Labor.

New York, April 30.—The action of Cardinal Taschereau, of Canada, in issuing his mandment forbidding Catholics from joining the Knights of Labor is attracting great attention in labor circles. Archbishop Gorrigan last evening referred a reporter to Monsignor Quinn. The latter said the propriety of Catholics becoming knights has been discussed by the officers of the church in New York, but no decision has been reached.
