Cieanliness and ventilation are in all cases and everywhere of the first importance. Those diseases which are appeared chiefly from place to place and from person to person by means of their own infection and contagion, are to be regarded and treated as enemists to be resisted and stamped out. The propagation to some of them with the help of local caises, seen or unseen, and the fatality as well as spread of each one of them is increased by personal uncleanness and local unhealth fulness. Diphtheria, measles, scarlet fever, typhoid fever, puerperal fever, and small prox are the most negligible.
