No one who saw the puny, spotted, mouldy stuff could doubt that its effect would be ruinous to our reputation as apple producers.

There must be a change in our method of apple culture. If the business is to prosper in the future we must grow a better quality of apples.

Now it seems to me that the most practical method of accomplishing this result is to train the apples on the tree when small.

This method is practiced universally in British Columbia, where probably the best apples in the world are grown.

There the Fruit Division might help us greatly if they would send an expert from British Columbia to instruct us as to the best methods of thinning fruit, time to thin, etc.

Although the past fall was an exceptional one as regards bad weather, scarcity of help, etc., the same thing is noticeable every year.
