The Chaudiere mill men as the out-

look for the lumber trade is good.

Quebec province maple sugar makers expect to supply 15,000,000 pounds this season.

Stiles A. H. of Hamilton, has secured the contract for the construction of waterworks for the town of Amherstburg, at a cost of \$30,000. He has also
