(To the Editor or the Globe.)

In the cors or hiz recent adres tu the Provincial Teachers' Association on 'Some Educational Failacies,' Rev. Principal Grant denounst with hiz uzual vigor the practis ov 'craming' in scools. A few minuts afterward, while outlining what in hiz opinion wud be a good public seed program, he insisted on the necesity ov making the pupils good spelers 'Dr. Grant was right in hiz denunciation ov 'craming;' but, in order tu free himself from a charj ov inconsisency, he wil hav to giv a somewhat unuzual definition or 'good speling Whatever he may hav ment by the expresion when he uzed it, it was certanly understood by all hiz hearers tu mean that in our scools every pupil shud be taut not merely au spel words corectly in the convertional way, but tu regard the ability tu do so az one ov the most important or educational accomplishments. If this is his view, then I beg ke .v tu say that in my opinion he iz try. ing tuperpetuate in our scools the most injurious and least defensible kind ov eraming that haz ever obtaind a footing in our educational system; that he iz not only huging his own fetra but iz. seeking tu rivet them on every Englishspeaking individual ov his own and subsequent generationz; that he is trying turender permanent on the shoulders oy the children a burden which the fathere hav been unabl tu bear, and that he iz not merely proclaiming himself a fetich worshiper but iz seeking to compel everyone els tu bowdown in the same superstitious frame ov mind before the contemptiblide he aderes.

I shal be glad tu lern that the lerned Principal ov Queen, S University did not mean all this when he maists on making all pupils good spelors.' I shal be still more glad tu hear that by 'good' apel. ing he means rational speling, and he noz-az every educated man noz-that our conventional speling is extremely irrational and caprishus. He noz that much time and money ar wasted in the efort tu make accol pupils expert spelers with very litt tu sho for it in the practis ov their after lives. He seeking tu perpetuate the tyranny ov

really betr than the so calld good spel ing, iz the more prevalent ov the two in spite ov the herculean and wasteful drujery it entails on both teachers and pupils. He noz that many otherwise acomplisht candidates for teachers'cor. tificates ar plukt becauz their orthografy iz a liti eccentric. He noz that hundreds ov candidates ar rejected every year at the Departmental and University examinations on acount ov mis. speld words in their rith papers. noz that theriz not a single English file logica! scolar ov any standing, in either England or America, who iz not an ernest advocate ov speling reform nog that the proces ov reforming the speling ov the German language izn w in ful blast under both scolarly and oficial auspices. Noing all these and many other facts tu which I might call h zat. tention, iz Dr. Grant prepard tu make a decided stand in favor or retaining our prezent caprishus system.

If he is not, then why in the name ov common sens does he insist on se much stres being laid upon 'good speling,'_ It is perfectly obvius that so long az su. perstitious reverens for our prezent orthografy dominates the mind ov the majority, any departure from it must be generally regarded az a mark ov illiter. acy. And yet nothing can be more unjust or absurd. I can spel az wel az most people; but if I choose tu spel "though" without the 'ugh as good English writers did haf a century ago, and az good English writers do tu day, I wud eudanger my reputation az an educated man. The same iz true ov such words as 'program.' 'catalog,' 'rime,' 'traveler and a host ov others, many ov which forms wad be condemd by nareminded l'versity and Departmental Examiners. I chalenj Dr Grant or any other person tu giv a singl good reason for regarding a man's mode ov speling English words as a proper criterion ov hiz literary or professional atainments. I hav seen reasons givn, but never one that wud stand a moment's investiga-

I apeal tu hedz ov colejes, like Dr. Grant and Dr. Wilson men whose standing as soolers is unquestiond in the community, not merely tu refrain from noz that so calld bad apeling, which is ignorance, tu which I refer, but tu
