VERMONT AND CANADA.



HE friendly feeling of our neighbours in the State of Vermont towards Canada, as shown by the visit of a company of Vermont citizen-soldiers to take part in the review recently held in Montreal on the birthday of our Queen, can scarcely be over-rated; this mutual good-will was reciprocated by our own Volunteers visiting St. Albans and joining in the celebration of the 4th July there; again, the State, through Governor Fairbanks, supplemented this cordial exhibition of amity by inviting Lord Dufferin to visit Vermont prior to his departure from Canada.

Probably it is not generally known that our neighbours are only repeating history, for it seems that the Vermonters exhibited a similar expression of friendship in 1794, on the occasion of the Queen's father, the Duke of Kent, visiting Burlington.
