(To the Editor of the Ontario Workman.) Sir,-Being a constant reader of your valuable paper, I send you the following items hoping they will prove of interest to you. Trade of all kinds is very dull here and several firms have taken advantage of the present state of affairs to reduce the wages of their employees. Messrs. Gilbert, Canada Marine Works have reduced the wages of their employees 20 per cent., Bartley & Co. 20 per cent. and a number of hands suspended for the present, Brush & Eagle Foundry have discharged a number of hands, the remainder having their wages reduced 20 per cent., McDougall & Co. are slack, Ives & Allen have closed their stoveplate shop and reduced wages 15 per cent., Clendinning & Co. have discharged a number of hands, the remainder are working 8 hours a day, and a reduction of 121 per cent. on wages. Engine Fitters, Machinists, Boiler Makers, &c. had better give Montreal a wide berth as there is hardly anything doing at their respective trades, -and fully three-fourths of the laboring class are out of employment, it being al-
