

sanctions studies agreed to in Vancouver. International banks were urged to refuse to participate in loan rescheduling exercises with South Africa. The Committee agreed to pursue means to secure a more concerted application of a global sanctions program, and specifically of the existing mandatory arms embargo. Ministers also held preliminary discussions with representatives of a number of opposition organizations.

In a visit to South Africa during August 1987, Mr. Clark expressed concern over actions taken by the Government of South Africa to further restrict peaceful opposition to the system of *apartheid*, and over South African attempts to destabilize its neighbours. In his meeting with the South African Foreign Minister, Mr. Clark again urged Pretoria to enter into negotiations with black leaders. More recently Canada has appealed to President Botha to exercise

clemency for the "Sharpeville Six" and condemned the imposition of further restrictions on 17 anti-*apartheid* groups, the trade union federation COSATU, and a number of individuals. Canada also made clear its unequivocal opposition to proposed legislation, now before the South African Parliament, to impede foreign funding of anti-*apartheid* activities.

In September Mr. Clark presented the second volume of the *Canadian Anti-Apartheid Register* to the Secretary-General of the United Nations, recording the actions taken by Canadian individuals, private organizations and various levels of government to express their opposition to *apartheid*.

In June 1987 Mr. Clark tabled in the House of Commons the second annual *Report on the Observance and Administration of the Code of Conduct Concerning the Employment*
