In 1951, Mr. Cadicux attonded the NATO Defence College in Paris prior to his appointment as Counscllor to the Canadion Delegation to the North Atlantic Council when it was established on a permanent basis in Poris in 1952. In 1954, when Canada agrecd to sorvo with India and Poland on the Commissions set up by the Geneva Conference, ho became senior political advisor to the Canadian Commissioner, International Supervisory Commission, Victname He retumed to Ottara in the spring of 1955 to becomo head of tho United Nations Division until his appointment as Assistant Under-Secretary on December 1, 1956. In this position Mr. Cadicux mas in charge of the plonning group of the Government Hospitality Committec which made arrangements for the visit of H.M. Qucon Elizabcth and Princc Phillip in 1957, and of $\mathrm{H}_{0} \mathrm{R}_{0} \mathrm{H}_{.}$The Princess Margarct in 1958.

Mr. Cadicux has attended many international conferences: in particular, the Conforence of Illicd Ministors of Education, Iondon, 1944; the Paris Pcace Conforcnce, 1946; and latcly, the Conforence on the Lan of tho Sca in Gcnova, 1958 and 1960, as Vicc-Chairman of the Delegation. He has attended sessions of the U.IV. Gencral hisscmbly, of the Economic and Sociol Council of the $U_{o} N_{0}$, and of the Council of Europe at Strasbourg. lir. Cadicux is now a member of the National Film Board and departmental representative on the Exccutive Committocof the UNESCO National Commission.

In addition to his official dutios, Mr. Cadicux has maintained his interost in acodemic and cultural activities. Since 1956 he has beon Professor of Public Intcrnational Lant, Faculty of Ian, University of Ottama; since 1959, ho has also lecturcd on Intcrnational Lan at the School of Graduatc Studics of the Faculty. He has just terminated a onc-ycar tcrm as Vicc-President of the National Gullcry issociation.

Ir. Cadicux is the author of a number of books on the Department and has contributcd articles to periodicals. Ho is marricd with ono child.
