TORONTO-INQUIRY AS TO ACTION TO RELIEVE SHORTAGE

Mr. Robert Stanbury (York-Scarborough): Mr. Speaker, I have a question for the Minister of Labour. In view of the now daily expressions of mounting public concern about the housing shortage in metropolitan Toronto-

These matters are now being considered with the United States and other governments.
