It is the intention of these two gentlemen to erect suitable stands in the Montreal Baseball Park and to play their lacrosse games there.

Kennedy states he has already the assurance of a good team if he is successful in his quest. As regards players, neither of the four clubs, should everything work favorably, need worry, as they will not doubt be besieged with requests for positions on the teams. For all pro players like to play where the most money is paid.

The National Commission President Barrow, Requests That Eastern League Be Elevated.

CINCINNATI, Nov. 9.—That the National Baseball Commission has obtained evidence regarding the charge that ticket manning was prevalent during the recent world's baseball series in New York and Philadelphia was indicated today when the commission decided to hold an investigation. A meeting will be held by the commission in New York on Dec. 11, at which the result of the investigation will be announced. The commission decided by unanimous vote that in future the sale of tickets for the series games shall be conducted by business representatives of the commission and the direct supervision of its members.

If the investigation now in progress develops evidence that warrants such action, the commission will in a finding fix the responsibility regardless of whether the club or any of its employees be affected. If, on the other hand, no substantial testimony is produced that either a club or any of its officials or employees are at fault, the commission will go on record as exonerating them.

The completion was in season for five hours, and the major part of this time has been devoted to the ticket scalping question.

President Edward Barrow of Toronto, and President Bain of the Eastern League, representing the Eastern League, appeared before the commission and presented requests that the Eastern League be elevated to a higher classification; that the limit of drafted and purchased players by the major league be lowered, and that the draft price be increased. The National Commission looked with favor on the request, and instructed the Eastern League representatives to take the matter up with the National Association and report back to the commission at its meeting in New York on Dec. 11.
