Would Bind Canada to Participate in European Wars

W. F. Maclean and Lapointe Call for Caution—Fielding Asks if Canada's Signing is Essential.

Special to The Toronto World. Ottawa, Sept. 2.—Speaker Fielding in the house of commons this afternoon when Hon. W. S. Fielding crossed swords with the prime minister over the peace treaty, Mr. Fielding had elaborately explained the provisions of the treaty and urged a speedy ratification.

Commits Canada to Wars. Ernest Lapointe of Kamouraska protested against the treaty being ratified without full consideration and debate. He pointed out that article 10 of the covenant of the League of Nations committed Canada to participation in future wars in which she might have no interest whatever.
