TREND IS HIGHER IN CORN MARKET

Prospect of Early Extension of Credits to Europe Chief Bullish Influence.

Chicago, Oct. 1.—Predictions that banking arrangements to grant commercial credits to Europe would soon be completed helped today to give an upward twist to the corn market. Prices unsettled at the close were 14c to 20c higher with December 1 3/4c to 1 1/2c, and May 1 1/4c to 1 1/2c. Oats gained 1/2c to 3/4c. In provisions the outcome ranged from 25c decline to a 5c advance. Notwithstanding that the corn market was not the opening and also at the close, sentiment during the day as a whole was strongly in favor of the bulls. The fact that continued rains were expected to curtail the country movement furnished the initial stimulus to buyers. Pronounced advances in the corn market were not the only feature of the day's trading. A better outlook for the United States furnished the initial stimulus to buyers. Lower quotations on hogs tended to turn in weaker provisions. Later, however, there were values owing to returns in grain and to signs of lard sales to Europe.

ON CHICAGO MARKET

Tomomson, Forwood & Co. received the following Chicago wire from Thomson, McKinnon & Co. yesterday: "The apathy heretofore prevailing in the corn market has been replaced by a change of sentiment and a broader outside interest. This condition is due to the stubborn undertone which the market has displayed some time and to the idea that values are sufficiently low until the producer becomes a more willing seller than at present. A better demand for corn appeared from shippers, who are bidding around 15 cents over December for ten days shipment from the country. Bids for new corn, first half of December, also all December shipment are at premiums over the new crop by the farmers that is mentioned in the extreme southwest. Where it is claimed that the offerings of basis 11, track, country station, are considerably larger than the demand."
