



MADE REPAYMENTS INTEREST BOOK SHOWS BOONS CAPITAL

How Small Sums Were Entered to Represent Large Amounts Outstanding to York Loan Credit.

Formal transfer of the property held by the City Realty Company for the York County Loan Company, was made yesterday by Joseph Phillips at the instigation of the National Trust Company.

An amusing incident cropped out yesterday in the police court, when at the end of the sitting a tax collector asked Crown Attorney Curry to allow Phillips permission to sign a cheque for the taxes on his personal income.

"He can't sign any cheques," said the crown attorney.

"But the city would lose money," urged the collector.

"Other people are," stated the crown attorney, refusing to make exception.

The National Trust got an order from Master in Chambers Cartwright stating that service of injunction on J. H. Jones, counsel for Phillips, was sufficient, and this was carried out.

One of the means by which Phillips swelled the statement of assets of the York County Loan Company was demonstrated in the investigation on Joseph Barrett and Miss Eva Hall.

Edward Drake, one time agent, superintendent and inspector for the York Loan, was in the box and detailed the arrangements for the sale of magazines, pianos, life insurance and York Loan stock.

"Did you ever buy any property?" asked Mr. Curry.

"Yes, the Ocean House, at King and Queen-streets. It was bought in my name by the York County Loan, which took a mortgage on it for \$21,000. The purchase price was \$22,000.

"Yes. Acting on instructions of Mr. Phillips I got two pupils. I am waiting for the first per cent. commission promised me, yet."

Joseph Barrett told Crown Attorney Curry he had owed about five or six hundred dollars for interest on loans, and Phillips asked him to have it \$3000 in order to make the annual statement make a good showing.

Eva Hall, bookkeeper, testified as to this amount, and also the Burt repayment of \$6500.

Ernest Hick of the Southern Lick gave evidence in reference to the vouchers given by his company to the York Loan.

Statistics Show Immensity of the First City of Civilization World.

The immensity of London, England is well illustrated in a volume just issued by the London County Council, entitled "A Statistical Abstract for London, 1905."

It is an amazing compilation, and shows that the British metropolis still holds the first place among the greatest cities of the world.

The rapidity of the growth of London during the last century is shown by the fact that, while in 1801 the population was 1,114,044, and risen in 1901 to 4,381,402, and the six and a half million people live in 928,008 houses.

Nothing is more impressive to the visitor to London than the enormous volume of the traffic. Londoners' propensity for cheap locomotion is strikingly indicated by the vast numbers of trams and omnibuses.

Of course, the tramway and omnibus statistics for 1904 do not adequately represent the traffic of the present day, as since the completion of the new tubes new electric car tracks have been opened, but they may be taken as a fair comparison with New York.

There were then 201 miles of tramway lines open, and during the year 537,946 passengers were conveyed, while 288,965,214 passengers traveled on the two principal omnibus companies' vehicles.

An interesting idea of the different sources of London's wealth may be gathered from the gross annual assessed value of the income tax in 1904, houses, etc., amounting to £45,055,871 (\$222,279,225); trades and professions being £74,806,453 (\$374,062,265); and the profit of public companies, and other interest and profits amounting to £143,534,555 (\$717,672,775).

"Wireless" Profits. Six Charles Euan-Smith told the shareholders in the Marconi Wireless Telegraphy Company, who met at River Plate House, in London, England, that the company was making steady progress.

The net profit was \$1000 in excess of that for the year which ended in September, 1904. Although they had been unable to complete the installations from which they expected their principal profit, they were deriving enough from other parts of the business to pay substantial dividends.

In view of the large expenses for development, however, it was thought inadvisable to make any distribution at present.

Used the Wrong Stamp. A letter written by Chairman W. H. Shaw when he was in Springfield a week ago, reached the board of education office yesterday.

It had been delayed in the dead letter department at Washington because the chairman used Canadian stamps.

Seven Times Round the World. W. Thomas, who has just retired after 33 years' service as postman between the Bog Mines and Minsterley, Shropshire, England, has walked 165,000 miles in the discharge of his duties. This is equal to nearly seven times around the world.

A Smuggler's Vault. A vault has been found in the yard of a hotel at Kirtouh-in-Bodley (Gloucestershire, England). It is supposed to have been the secret place of smugglers, who used the hotel as a storage place for contraband goods.

MAY BE WANTED HERE.

Man Arrested in Detroit Identified With Man Who Jumped Bail.

Sergeant Duncan is now positive that the A. M. Rors who is under arrest in Detroit on the charge of stealing \$1000 worth of goods from J. M. Menon, by whom he was employed, is the same man who paid his respects to Toronto merchants in October, 1904.

His victims here were: A. A. Allen & Company, for \$50; S. P. McKinnon & Company, for \$150; and John Macdonald & Company, for \$250. Rors was arrested, and given his liberty on a cash bail furnished by a relative. He skipped the town and the bail was forfeited. The party who furnished the cash was a poor man and the loss to him was considerable.

In case Rors is acquitted, he will be held by the Detroit police in case the Ontario government wish to extradite him.

BURGALAR WAS TOO EARLY.

Belleveur, April 11.-(Special).-A burglar operating in the premises of R. Davis and Sons, dry goods merchants, while endeavoring to remove the cash drawer from the safe, was interrupted by a member of the firm.
