Ottawa, July 12.—The Controller of Mounted Police is informed by his officers on the routes to the Yakon that between 27,000 and 30,000 souls have crossed the summits of the passes beyond the Lynn Canal, and at least 20,000 are on their way down the rivers beyond Bennett to the gold fields.
