SEALING DISPUTE SETTLED. -

United States Government to Buy Out the Schooners Engaged in the Industry.

Victoria, B. C., Feb. 7.-News has just reached here that the sealing dispute has at length reached a settlement, and if the United States Senate ratify the decision by United States Senate ratify the decision by the commissioners, the business is to be a thing of the past, the American Government to buy out the schooners engaged in the industry at \$12\text{St}\$ a ton, but not to become owner of the vessels, which are to revert to their owners, the payment being made, as it were, for the stoppage of the industry. According to a letter received from a Victorian now at Washington, D.C., the representative of the sealers, Capt. J. G. Cox, made this offer to the commissioners, who accepted it subject to the ratification of the United States Senate. The business will then be at an end as far as Canada is concerned, and the Dominion Government, it is understood, will be asked to prosecute any vessel coming in with skins.

MORGAN'S GREAT GRAFT. The Britisher Has Got Great Things

in the Province of Szechuan in China.

London, Feb. 7.—Mr. William Pritchard Morgan, member of Parliament for the Merthyr Tydvil division of Wales, has arrived here from China. In an interview he confirms the success of his mission in having secured concessions from the Chinese Government which provides for opening up the rich Province of Szechuan to the trade of the world. The agreements have been formally signed, and Mr. Morgan has been appointed foreign financial, legal and technical administrator of the province. All the foreign Ministers at Pekin approved of the concessions, except the French Minister, who strenuously protested against them on the ground that they constitute a monopoly and are an interference with treaty rights.

Mr. Morgan's prospecting and exploring expedition, consisting of a dozen British, American and Chinese officials, including Prof. Monroe Ferguson, the scientist of Pittsburg, Pa., departed for Szechuan on Jan. 1. Mr. Morgan and his associates are acting in partnership with an American syndicate and the Chinese authorities. The contract gives Mr. Morgan's associates control of all the mines and oil fields in the Province of Szechuan.

Tariff on Alcohol. The Grand Trunk and Canadian Pacific have put into effect a new tariff on alcohol, high wines, pure spirits and whiskey shipped from all points in Ontario to Kootenay pounds. The rate will be \$1.80 per 100 pounds, with the minimum weight of a carload at 24,000 pounds. The same rate will be put into force on the Intercelonial. The two big roads have also announced a new rate on the above articles from all points in Ontario to all Pacific coast points, making the rate \$1 per 100 pounds.
