CHADIAN MANUFACTURERS ASSN.

Spice and Extract Trade Organize a Greater Section.

A number of prominent men in the spice and extract trade met yesterday at the Canadian Manufacturers' Association headquarters in the Board of Trade Building.

The officers elected were: Chairman, H. A. Donald, Toronto; vice-chairman, J. E. Stewart, Toronto; Executive Committee, G. W. Ewing, Montreal; William Gorman, London; J. J. McArthur, Hamilton; G. S. Dunn, Hamilton; A. Mayell, Toronto; J. Ward, Halifax.

The main object of the section is to improve the present conditions of the spice trade, and to secure a uniform high quality for Canadian package goods.

The section will also assume an attitude of uncompromising hostility to the inferior imported articles that are now glutting the market.

The rigid enforcement of the Adulteration Act is also on the program, and if the section should accomplish nothing more than a check on the wholesale adulteration of spice goods it would be deserving of support.

The organizers of the section would like the term, "Canadian," as applied to the goods, to be synonymous with "good quality."

Dividend of G.T.R.

London, Feb. 6.—The Grand Trunk dividend statement, issued to-day, declares a full dividend of 4 per cent, guaranteed, and first and second preferences, 5 1/2 per cent, on third preference, leaving £4000 carried forward. This amount equals the market expectations. The net receipts were £287,000, and the surplus £287,000.

Paets re Ottawa.

Ottawa, Feb. 6.—The number of industries in Ottawa is stated to be 22. The capital invested is \$1,000,000, persons employed 8500, salaries paid \$1,500,000, and value of product \$10,000,000. The amount invested in lumber and sawmills is \$2,000,000, wages paid \$1,000,000, and value of the products \$3,000,000.
