For two years the work of building a military airship has been in progress both Colonel Templar and Colonel Capper, R. E., having been engaged in the task. The latter is now in command of the aerial section, but Colonel Templar is still consulted and frequently visits the establishment. Progress was very slow until recently when the great development of Continental airships gave an impetus to English designers. Since then the work has proceeded rapidly.
