some employers them to operate satisfactorily."

"Fifty per cent of the cost of commodities today." he said, "is due to friction interjected into our industrial relations. We must bring about industrial harmony."

Enemies to Co-Operation.

He said there were elements in adverse to any co-operative steps, and that he was satisfied that if representatives of capital and labor got together to consider all the detailed things causing disquiet these matters could be adjusted.

"I am satisfied," continued Mr. Neill, "that industrial unrest is a good thing in some ways, because it will result in a much more efficient operation of industries. Changes which must come will bring to the worker a more adequate percentage of the results of his labor and also a more thorough realization of his responsibilities as a workman."

He told of the establishment in workman."
He told of the establishment in Vancouver of an industrial council in the case of three dairies. Representatives of employers and workers sat in equal numbers and adjusted mutual differences, and two "bumps," he told the commissioners, had been passed successfully. Several other councils were under consideration.
