FIND MISSING MAN IN NORTH ONTARIO

Ft. William Man in Woods Two Weeks, Nearly Famished.

Port Arthur, Ont., Aug. 8.—David Kincaid, the returned soldier, who has been missing in the neighborhood of Loon Lake, 90 miles east of Port Arthur, was picked up by a passing train this morning at Mile "Ninety-Two." Kincaid has been in the woods for the past two weeks, apparently living on berries and roots. He was taken to his home in Port William this afternoon.

The finding of Kincaid brings to a close one of the longest man hunts in this section of the country. Ever since his disappearance hundreds of citizens from Port Arthur and Port William, Indians, Mounted Police and returned soldiers have been scouring the woods.

According to the story of the train crew, Kincaid crawled out to the track, being too weak to walk and was placed in the caboose of the freight train.

Identify Man Killed by Train.
But Home City Still Unknown
Belleville, Ont., Aug. 8.—(Special.)—That the man who was killed on the G.T.R. track near Marysville, in Hastings county, on July 22, was named George Wellington, was established at the inquest held here. Where the deceased's home was is unknown. Some pay envelopes found on the clothing were the name of George Wellington, and such a person sought to recover, through a legal firm in Toronto, \$30 for picking berries for a person named George Orr, at Clarkson, Ont.

Alcohol Plant, Corbyville, Has Narrow Escape From Fire
Belleville, Ont., Aug. 8.—(Special.)—The Canadian Industrial Alcohol Company plant at Corbyville, known as Corby's distillery, had a narrow escape from serious damage by fire at a late hour on Friday night. A blaze started in a laboratory where a large quantity of alcohol is stored. By prompt action the fire was prevented from spreading, and the damage was done to documents by water, which was freely used.

OUTLOOK FOR FUEL GOOD IN BRANTFORD

Enough Wood to Last Winter—Coal Arrives for Manufacturers.

Brantford, Aug. 8.—(Special.)—Some difficulty is being found by local employees in securing sufficient common laborers. Factories are advertising for men, even though the stock-taking period is near at hand. The works department of the city needs 50 men for work on the new sewers, and difficulty is being found in securing these.

Aid. J. T. Burrows, the civic wood expert, stated this morning that the civic authorities were not worrying much over the fuel situation, as the city would have enough wood for the winter. There was a lot of wood still on the Harley farm to be delivered to the city, the same being stacked up and in the drying process. Most of the cutting was done last winter. Local manufacturing firms are not having much difficulty in getting an adequate

supply of soft coal, and some firms are receiving several cars daily. Men from all parts of Brant county are daily registering at the local employment office, and they are being sent on immediately to Winnipeg. Thresher operators are paid as high as \$10 a day, and men for field work are paid \$8. It is understood that a day's work means from sunrise to sunset.

Farmers Meet City Wages.
District farmers are not having a great deal of difficulty with their harvesting. It was expected earlier in the season that it would be difficult to secure men, but now that the farmers are meeting city wages the men are quickly registering.

Aug. 18 has been chosen for the day when the donor of the Y.W.C.A. camp at Port Dover will formally hand over the deeds to the board of directors that will put the property in the possession of the women. The occasion will take the form of a memorial service for the late Mrs. Cockshutt, in whose memory his mother, Mrs. James Cockshutt, has given the camp by being held.

Willard Hall has finally been opened as the permanent home of the baby clinics and the headquarters for social service work in the city.

FOREST FIRES IN B.C. PERSIST—NO WINDS YET
Nelson, B.C., Aug. 7.—An area of two miles square in the Salmon Valley, near Erie, is on fire, and as yet the blaze, which so far includes no important timber, is not under control. With the wind variable, there is no certainty which way the fire will head, but the efforts of the 45 men working on it is to head it off from good timber. About 2000 acres of timber between Lafrance and Lockhart creeks, on Kootenay lake, are burning, and there is also a serious fire on Ray creek, a tributary of Coffee creek, above Alseworth. Each of these fires is being fought by crews of 21 men. There are now fires in many parts of the district, and, owing to the dryness of the season, once started, they persisted in full spite of rain, and, undoubtedly the conditions of July, 1919, will be duplicated in a few hours.

OUTLOOK FOR FUEL GOOD IN BRANTFORD

Enough Wood to Last Winter—Coal Arrives for Manufacturers.

Brantford, Aug. 8.—(Special.)—Some difficulty is being found by local employees in securing sufficient common laborers. Factories are advertising for men, even though the stock-taking period is near at hand. The works department of the city needs 50 men for work on the new sewers, and difficulty is being found in securing these.

Aid. J. T. Burrows, the civic wood expert, stated this morning that the civic authorities were not worrying much over the fuel situation, as the city would have enough wood for the winter. There was a lot of wood still on the Harley farm to be delivered to the city, the same being stacked up and in the drying process. Most of the cutting was done last winter. Local manufacturing firms are not having much difficulty in getting an adequate

supply of soft coal, and some firms are receiving several cars daily. Men from all parts of Brant county are daily registering at the local employment office, and they are being sent on immediately to Winnipeg. Thresher operators are paid as high as \$10 a day, and men for field work are paid \$8. It is understood that a day's work means from sunrise to sunset.

Farmers Meet City Wages.
District farmers are not having a great deal of difficulty with their harvesting. It was expected earlier in the season that it would be difficult to secure men, but now that the farmers are meeting city wages the men are quickly registering.

Norman General, Brantford's representative in the Olympic Marathon, has left to sail for Antwerp.

Aug. 18 has been chosen for the day when the donor of the Y.W.C.A. camp at Port Dover will formally hand over the deeds to the board of directors that will put the property in the possession of the women. The occasion will take the form of a memorial service for the late Mrs. Cockshutt, in whose memory his mother, Mrs. James Cockshutt, has given the camp by being held.

Willard Hall has finally been opened as the permanent home of the baby clinics and the headquarters for social service work in the city.

FOREST FIRES IN B.C. PERSIST—NO WINDS YET
Nelson, B.C., Aug. 7.—An area of two miles square in the Salmon Valley, near Erie, is on fire, and as yet the blaze, which so far includes no important timber, is not under control. With the wind variable, there is no certainty which way the fire will head, but the efforts of the 45 men working on it is to head it off from good timber. About 2000 acres of timber between Lafrance and Lockhart creeks, on Kootenay lake, are burning, and there is also a serious fire on Ray creek, a tributary of Coffee creek, above Alseworth. Each of these fires is being fought by crews of 21 men. There are now fires in many parts of the district, and, owing to the dryness of the season, once started, they persisted in full spite of rain, and, undoubtedly the conditions of July, 1919, will be duplicated in a few hours.

CONSECON MAN IS DROWNED.
Belleville, Ont., Aug. 8.—(Special.)—Clarence Hough, a C.N.R. section man, living near Consecon, Ameliasburg township, was drowned yesterday in Robinson's Creek, about two miles from his home. He was 21 years of age, and was a son of Mr. and Mrs. B. Hough, of Ameliasburg.
