

*The Sixth Annual Meeting of the "HALIFAX ASSOCIATION IN AID OF THE COLONIAL CHURCH AND SCHOOL SOCIETY," was held at Temperance Hall, on Tuesday Evening, 13th Decr., 1853.*

The LORD BISHOP OF NOVA SCOTIA in the Chair.

Rev. J. T. Twining, D.D., offered up prayer.

Extracts from the Report of the Committee having been read, on the motion of the Rev. R. F. UNIACKE, and seconded by P. C. HILL, Esq., it was—

*Resolved*, That the Report, of which extracts have now been read, be adopted; and this meeting desires to express its attachment to the principles upon which this Society is based, and gratitude to God for its increasing sphere of operations and usefulness, and discerns therein an urgent call upon Christians generally to earnest prayer for a blessing upon its labors and to enlarged liberality in its support.

On the motion of the Rev. GEORGE HILL, seconded by Mr. MARRIOTT, it was—

*Resolved*, That the commencement of the Training and Model School in this city by the Society, is a cause for much thankfulness: whilst it imposes upon the friends and supporters of it in the Province fresh motives to exertion for the success of this undertaking in particular, and for the Society's objects generally, both here and elsewhere.

On the motion of the Rev. E. MATURIN, seconded by WILLIAM HOWE, Esq., it was—

*Resolved*, That the spiritual darkness existing in the world, the prevalence of ignorance, superstition and error, and the astonishing events which are frequently occurring, appeal to all true believers for increased efforts in order to make known the Gospel of Christ more fully, as the sovereign remedy for the wants of mankind.

On the motion of the Rev. J. C. COCHRAN, seconded by WM. SILVER, Esq., it was—

*Resolved*, That the thanks of this meeting be presented to the LORD BISHOP for taking the Chair: also to the friends of the Society for their subscriptions and donations, and to the Clergy of Halifax and other parts of the Diocese for the use of their pulpits for the advocacy of the Society; and that the following gentlemen be the office-bearers and committee for the ensuing year.
