Dear Sir:-

Further to my K-G-37 of the 21st inst., referring to the timber situation on the Tobacco Plains Reserve, I am now in receipt of a letter from Mr. Farmer F.S. Ryckman of the Kootenay Agency, in which he states that in accordance with my instructions he visited Tobacco Plains Reserve. I beg to enclose copy of the said letter.

You will see that the gist of the said letter is to the effect that he as already mentioned in my previous letter there is an awful lot of waste. However, it seems to be so much that Mr. Ryckman seems disposed to think that he could not make an accurate enough scale.

If you will kindly, therefore, let me know whether a licensed scaler should be employed or whether a rough scale done by Mr. Ryckman would be sufficient, I will write instructions to the Kootenay Agency accordingly.

✓ Please also let me have instructions regarding the paragraph about the trees that have blown down.
