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A letter is not liable to additional postage for being sent by one Office *through* another office and there re-mailed, except the *distance* from the Office where it was originally mailed, to its ultimate destination shall warrant it—neither if sent out of the proper route by mistake of a Postmaster, as a letter to be rated for the distance it has unnecessarily travelled.
