## Asserts Veniot Cabinet, Anticipating Enabling Legislation, Spent Half Million of 1926 and 1927 Money

For Road Improvement

"THE capital debt of the Province now stands at \$32,364,909, which, with outstanding bills incurred during the present year, will be increased by more than \$1,744,223, making the total at least \$34,109,132," was the statement made in an inter-view by Premier Baxter yesterday. "The latter figure," he said, "will be increased by bills which are yet to come in for road and bridge work which is charg-able to capital and which the Provincial Treasurer is unable to estimate. This is expected to run into hundreds of thousands of dollars, but it is impossible to check it up as yet and the total may not be known accurately even when the books close on 31st October.

"Capital liability has been incurred not only without the authority of the legislature but in distinct defance of its enactments. In 1923 the government put through a measure which redited that the agreement with the Dominion Government to give federal aid to roads had expired and that no assurance had been received that it would be continued. The government was therefore authorised to improve and reconstruct an indefly te mileage of the roads and for this purpose was authorised to borrow not exceeding \$250,000 in any one year for three years from 1st January, 1928. It was distinctly provided that if in any one year the annual sum of \$260,000 was not borrowed, the amount not borrowed might be borrowed in any subsequent year in addition to the amount authorized for that year. At the last session the mount to be borrowed was increased of \$280,000 each year.






