

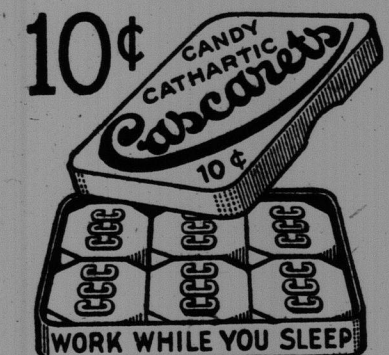

tive beauty and richness of coloring upon only to the tropics, the enervating, languorous heat; the incipient invitation from nature to lie down and loiter in the grateful shade and let the world whirl on through the scenes of what's to come.

"This is the country into the heart of which the Canadian wilderness sticks a railway. Already they are organized for victory. In southern countries railroading is not a game, it is a business. Upon the generous scale that prevails in the more northerly latitudes. In the Province of Ontario, and containing more than 55,000,000 people, are altogether less than 1,000 miles of railway. One of the reasons, of course is that there is a great difficulty and much capital expense involved in penetrating the jungle, and the other is that the settlements are so widely scattered. Only in special cases, such as the present, where the discovery of an oil field created the necessity, is there justification for an outlay necessitated by the construction of a railway into the back country.

"The Infantas oil field, on the Tropical Company's concession, is situated at a point 350 miles up the Magdalena River from its mouth at Barranquilla on the Caribbean, and is there 24 miles from the river. At the river landing is a refinery, built at large expense of cash and worry and at the loss of life, and round about it the Canadian version of what village life should be in the tropics of South America. The village is Barranca. Back through the jungle a wagonroad had been chopped and graded to the oil fields. Across a country where the rich red mud that forms the soil is plastic as putty and where every rainfall rips ravines across the right of way, the construction of this wagonroad was not easy and its maintenance has been a constant aggravation and expense. Connecting the refinery at Barranca with the Infantas oil field is a pipe line 25 miles in length. Its construction was one of the achievements of the country two years ago and following very closely thereon came the commencement of

"The railway is now officially started and construction is well under way. The day of its completion is as yet indeterminate, but it is certain. Troubles among the native laborers held back work at the start, as it always does with every enterprise in the south, but this now appears to be permanently in the past. Materials are slow in arriving. Most of these are purchased from some part of the United States or Canada and after having been transported by railway car from the ocean steamer to the river steamer have to be brought a laborious four-day journey up the Magdalena to Guen landing, and from there brought to the front in the jungle.
