

London, Dec. 4—(Canadian Press despatch from Reuter's, Limited)—Marshal Foch, in a mesage issued through Reuter's agency on the eve of his departure from London, expresses to the British public how happy, touched, grateful and proud he feels in view of the unforgettable reception he has been given in London.

"That reception was the exact reflection of the sincere and intimately close union which has animated us on the field of honor and which has enabled us together to whack our common enemy and which will continue to bind us one to other," the marshal continued. "I fully reciprocate the sentiments which I have had expressed to me here, and I am happy and proud at having inspired them."

HIGHER RANGE TODAY.

Chicago, Dec. 4—Corn averaged higher in price today owing more to scarcity of offerings than to any urgent buying.
