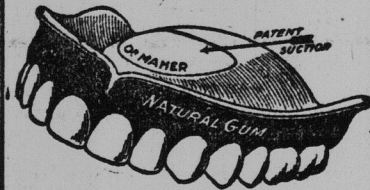

ROOSEVELT'S LAST MESSAGE WAS A STIRLING APPEAL FOR LOYALTY

Col. Roosevelt's last message to the American people was a plea to continue the fight for "Americanism." It was delivered at the all-American benefit concert, given by the American Defence Society in the Hippodrome last night. It was read by Henry C. Quimby, a trustee of the society, because of the colonel's indisposition. The text of the message follows:

"I cannot be with you, and so all I can do is to wish you Godspeed. There must be no giving back in the fight for Americanism merely because the war is over. There are plenty of persons who have already made the assertion that they believe the American people have a short memory and that they intend to revive all the foreign associations which most directly interfere with the complete Americanization of our people. Our principle in this matter should be absolutely simple. In the first place, we should insist that if the immigrant who comes here does in good faith become an American and assimilates himself to us, he shall be treated on an exact equality with everyone else, for it is an outrage to discriminate against any such man because of creed or birthplace or origin. But this is predicated upon the man's becoming in very fact an American and nothing but an American. If he tries to keep segregated with men of his own origin and separated from the rest of America, then he is not doing his part as an American. There can be no divided
